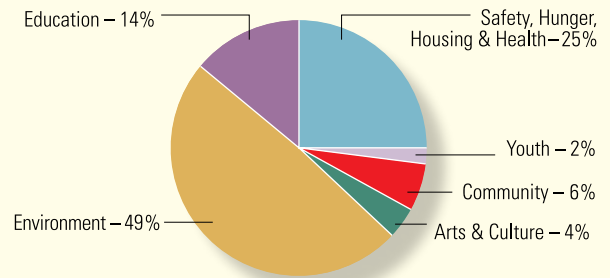
The American Electric Power Foundation was created in 2005 to provide ongoing resources for charitable initiatives involving higher dollar values and multi-year commitments than AEP's operating companies might be able to provide individually. Funded by AEP and its utility operating units, the Foundation's giving in 2007 reflects significant commitments benefiting communities in our 11-state service area and beyond, such as:

- A \$30,000 grant for the Arkansas Multi-Language Computer Laboratory at Cossatot Community College of the University of Arkansas in DeQueen;
- \$100,000 for the United Hispanic Americans Inc. advocacy and service center in Fort Wayne, Indiana;
- A grant of \$100,000 to support local public television programming in Kentucky;
- \$5 million as part of a two-year pledge for development of the Scioto Mile urban greenspace along the Scioto River in downtown Columbus, Ohio;
- A \$25,000 grant to the Boys & Girls Club of Greater Kingsport, Tennessee;
- \$50,000 for the Texas State Aquarium in Corpus Christi;
- \$25,000 for the W.E. Skelton 4-H Education Conference Center at Smith Mountain Lake in Virginia;
- \$100,000 to the Library Foundation of Kanawha County in Charleston, West Virginia, for a building capital campaign;
- \$355,000 to the National Energy Education Development (NEED) Project to provide compact fluorescent bulbs and energy-efficiency education for fourth-grade students in Arkansas, Indiana, Kentucky, Louisiana, Michigan, Ohio, Oklahoma, Tennessee, Texas, Virginia and West Virginia.

The Foundation's areas of focus include education from early childhood through higher education, protecting the environment, providing basic human services in the areas of hunger, housing, health and safety, and enriching life through art, music and cultural heritage. The Foundation is based in Columbus, Ohio.
